


One Winter's Day


A mother deer and her fawn were sheltering in the bushes. "Oh Little Hedgehog, why aren't you in your nest in this awful storm?" she asked.

When he opened the door a prickly snowball rolled in. "Gracious me!" he said in surprise. "It's Little Hedgehog!"




“For the kindest hedgehog in the world!” they all cried together.
